

## Safety Data Sheet (SDS)

Safety Data Sheets (SDS) are a requirement of REACH Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006.

The supplier of a substance or a mixture must provide the recipient of the substance or mixture with a safety data sheet complied in accordance with REACH Annex II, if

- the substance or mixture is hazardous according to Regulation (EC) No 1272/2008 (harmonized classification, labelling and packaging of substances and mixtures CLP);
- the substance or mixture is persistent, bioaccumulative and toxic (PBT) or very persistent and very bioaccumulative (vPvB) in accordance with the criteria set out in REACH Annex XIII; or
- a substance is included in the Candidate List of substances of very high concern for Authorisation (REACH Article 33).

Safety Data Sheet consist of the following headings:

- 1. identification of the substance/ mixture and of the company/undertaking;
- 2. hazards identification;
- 3. composition/information on ingredients;
- 4. first-aid measures;
- 5. fire-fighting measures;
- 6. accidental release measures;
- 7. handling and storage;
- 8. exposure controls/personal protection;
- 9. physical and chemical properties;
- 10. stability and reactivity;
- 11. toxicological information;
- 12. ecological information;
- 13. disposal considerations;
- 14. transport information;
- 15. regulatory information;
- 16. other information.

## Safety Data Sheets are a requirement for hazardous substances and mixtures, not for articles or complex objects.

There are other legal requirements in force to gain information about hazardous substances in articles, such as REACH Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 Article 33. For articles there is no requirement to create documents as detailed as a SDS, as REACH Article 33 merely requires the name of the contained substance(s) of the Candidate List as a minimum, if contained >0,1% (w/w) in an article.
